
MEMORANDUM FOR FILES

SUBJECT: Provision of Fund Technical Assistance to Nonmember Countries

I am most grateful to you for sending me a copy of your memorandum to Mr. Zulu dated September 23, 1983.

Regarding your third paragraph, you may be interested in a memorandum regarding expressions of interest that I have found in our files. In view of a number of contacts with Mozambique, I suggested to the Deputy Secretary that the Executive Board should be informed that Mozambique had been showing interest in membership, in accordance with the policy accepted by Mr. Witteveen in 1977. Despite all those contacts, the Deputy Secretary decided that there was insufficient expression of interest in membership to warrant informing the Executive Board.

I wonder therefore whether your last sentence, despite its prudent language, is quite in accordance with the Fund's rather special use of the term "expressions of interest".

Mozambique - Fund's Relations

1. At your request I enclose two copies in English of the Fund's membership booklet. I believe that it is self-explanatory, except that any country joining the Fund after December 31, 1980 will not for now be entitled to an SDR allocation. Consequently, while it is hoped that all members will become participants in the SDR Department, (Appendix H), the benefits are less immediate than they would have been.

Appendices I onward can be attended to after the attainment of membership; but Appendix F—appointment of Governor and Alternate Governor—needs early action if the country is to benefit fully from membership, and Appendix K has to be dealt with within 30 days after the attainment of membership. The Fund staff naturally helps with all these appendices, and particularly Appendix K.

2. The last formal document on Mozambique produced by the Fund was SM/75/164. As you can see by the date, this is quite out of date. The latest data refer to 1973.

3. I attach a copy of each of the accounts—one diplomatic, one technical—of a meeting with UN staff on Mozambique in May 1976; together with a copy of a summary I wrote in January 1978. The Executive Board was not informed of the interest of Mozambique, mentioned in this latter.

Mozambique - Membership

A Fund staff mission visited Mozambique in March 1975 and reported in SW/75/164 (7/1/75).

On May 25, 1976 a discussion took place, at their request, between two members of the UN staff concerned with Mozambique and members of the Fund staff. The UN staff recalled that the Secretary-General had invited the specialized agencies to assist Mozambique: the Fund staff replied that financial assistance could only be provided to members, and limited technical assistance to those who had applied for membership. Later in 1976 the Fund declined invitations to two separate meetings in Geneva for the purpose of discussing Mozambique.

On June 20, 1977 Mr. Anderson, responding to a cable received on June 15, sent to Mr. Essien, Deputy Resident Representative, UNDP, Maputo, for the Mozambique Government, the Fund Directory, IFS, and "Operations and Transactions in Special Drawing Rights", but nothing on membership.

Mr. Mung'omba yesterday asked for membership materials "for Mozambique".

Perhaps the time has come to inform the Executive Directors of the interest of Mozambique in accordance with the policy accepted by the Managing Director at EBM/77/123 (8/11/77).

DATE: September 23, 1983

I promised to let you know of the results of our inquiries concerning the eligibility of a nonmember country for Fund technical assistance, in connection with your forthcoming meeting with the delegation from Mozambique. After discussions with Messrs. Duvaux (CBD), Kay (SEC), Latham (FAD), and Ogoola (LEG), the situation is as follows.

1. Technical assistance may be provided by the Fund to a nonmember country if an application for membership has been made. The Secretary's Department indicated that a membership application must be formal and in writing. 1/ However, the preliminary interpretation of the Legal Department is that other evidence of actively seeking membership may be sufficient to enable the country to request Fund technical assistance. The Legal Department is in the process of researching the issue more thoroughly, and its conclusions will be communicated to you in due course.

2. Fund assistance to a country in the context of preparing an application for membership in the Fund may also be provided. The Fund staff may not, however, "encourage" countries to become members or to accelerate the procedure for becoming members (normally entailing a six-month period between application and membership).

3. There appears to be no clear evidence of Mozambique's intention to apply for membership, whether in the form of a written application or in other forms. The chronology of events sent to you earlier, however, includes a number of contacts which could be construed as indirect expressions of general interest.

Mozambique - Membership

Mr. Philip Morris, World Bank, telephoned to say that he takes part in meetings of the group (SADEC) that is working on development in Southern Africa. There he has had conversations with delegates from Mozambique, who have been asking about the procedure for joining the Fund, and the World Bank.

Mr. Morris' impression was that the Mozambique authorities were shifting from their former rather firm views. In particular, they have signed the so-called "Berlin Treaty," which opened the way for the receipt of EC funds and West German assistance.





In view of the difficulties being encountered by the Field Office, the Resident Representative in Mozambique has requested that the following visa and hotel booking requirements be brought to your attention.

Visa: All travellers to Mozambique, including UNDP holders, are required to obtain an entry visa. The UNDP Office will assist in securing its issuance upon arrival, provided the following information is received at least 20 days in advance for UN personnel and dependents, 45 days for relatives:
(a) full name, (b) date and place of birth, (c) nationality, (d) usual place of residence, (e) passport number, place and date of issue, (f) profession, (g) purpose of visit, (h) expected duration of visit, (i) point of entry (airport, border), (j) name and nationality of father and mother.

Hotel Accommodation: Due to scarcity of hotel accommodation, one month advance notice should be given to the UNDP Office to arrange hotel bookings. Travel should not be undertaken until confirmation is received from the UNDP Office.

Strict compliance with the above is requested.

MAPUTO, Dec 14, REUTER -- AN AMERICAN DELEGATION HAS MADE THE FIRST DIPLOMATIC CONTACT BETWEEN THE REAGAN ADMINISTRATION AND THE COMMUNIST MOZAMBIQUE.

SENIOR DEPUTY SECRETARY OF STATE FOR AFRICAN AFFAIRS FRANK WISNER HELD TALKS YESTERDAY WITH PRESIDENT SAMORA MACHEL OF MOZAMBIQUE ON BILATERAL ECONOMIC AND POLITICAL RELATIONS, DIPLOMATIC SOURCES SAID.

WISNER ARRIVED IN MAPUTO YESTERDAY AT THE HEAD OF A FOUR-MAN DELEGATION.

THE SOURCES SAID THE U.S. MISSION HAS A FOLLOW-UP TO LAST OCTOBER'S "VERY POSITIVE" MEETING IN NEW YORK BETWEEN SECRETARY OF STATE GEORGE SCHULTZ AND MOZAMBICAN FOREIGN MINISTER JORQUIN CHISSANO, WHO WILL HOLD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE VISITING TEAM.

THEY ADDED THAT YESTERDAY TALKS TOUCHED MARGINALLY ON INDEPENDENCE FOR SOUTH AFRICAN RULED NAMIBIA (SOUTH WEST AFRICA). BOTH MAPUTO AND WASHINGTON ARE INVOLVED IN LENGTHY NEGOTIATIONS FOR THE FORMER GERMAN COLONY'S INDEPENDENCE.





VIENNA CONVENTION ON DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS
OF APRIL 18, 1961

ACCESSION OF MOZAMBIQUE

The Secretary-General of the United Nations Organization, in his capacity as depository of the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations of April 18, 1961, communicates the following:

The instrument of accession to the aforementioned Convention by the Government of Mozambique was deposited on November 18, 1981 with the Secretary-General.

The instrument of accession contains the following statement:

(Translation) The People's Republic of Mozambique takes this opportunity to draw attention to the discriminatory nature of Articles 48 and 50 of this Convention which exclude certain States from acceding to it. In view of the Convention's broad scope affecting interests of all countries of the world, it should be open to membership by all States.

The People's Republic of Mozambique considers that association with other States in a convention does not constitute official recognition of those States.

In accordance with Article 51, paragraph 2 of the Convention, the latter entered into force for Mozambique on the thirtieth day after its instrument of accession was deposited, namely, December 18, 1981.
