Department's circular telegrams May 25 and June 3 regarding United Nations Monetary and Financial Conference.

The Ministry of State indicates verbally that the following will probably compose the Cuban Delegation: Dr. Eduardo Montoulieu, Minister of Finance, head of the delegation with Drs. Garcia Lontes and Ramiro Guerra as delegates and the following as technical advisers: Miguel Pirez; Eduardo Durruthy; Calixto Montoulieu, all of the Ministry of Finance; Manuel Menocal, Professor of Fiscal Law, Habana University; Luis Machado (acting as representative for President oloct Grau) and Dr. Folipe Pazos, Commercial Attache of the Cuban Embassy in Washington. Irving Gordon of that Embassy will act as private secretary to Dr. Montoulieu.

The Ministry hopes to confirm these names shortly.


Department's circular telegram June 3, 6 p.m. regarding the United Nations Monetary and Financial Conference.

The Linister of Finance, who is leaving June 18 for New York prior to attending the conference, confirms the makeup of the Cuban delegation transmitted in Embassy's telegram No. 574, June 13. I expect official notification shortly from Finistry of State. Finistry of Finance would appreciate ascertaining as soon as possible the date and approximate hour at which the special train leaves Lashington for Bretton Hoods and informs Embassy that the office requirements of the Cuban delegation can be limited to one room.

I plan to issue air priorities from Habana to Mashington for all the members of the Guban delegation except Dr. Pazos and Irving Gordon, who are already in Mashington.


