I am of the opinion that the message from the Secretary of the Treasury to the Dominican Minister of Finance quoted in the Department's circular telegram of June 10, 6 p.m. will not (repeat not) favorably impress the Dominican authorities if transmitted in its present form. In the first paragraph the message states that technical experts of other countries are being invited to cooperate in the preparation of an agenda, where as the second paragraph, specifying the countries so invited, omits the Dominican Republic but includes Cuba and Mexico.

I should appreciate being informed whether the Department, notwithstanding the above, wishes the message communicated in its present form or whether it would consider either eliminating the second paragraph or withholding the message altogether.
