Mr. Smyrnov said he had a few questions. First, he wanted to know whether White wanted to discuss the Joint Statement of Principles or the American draft outline of the Stabilization Fund. White answered both, said the Joint Statement first and then the larger document as a whole incorporating many details. White then said he had a new copy of the Joint Statement of Principles to give the Russians, incorporating the British cabled suggestions which he said the Treasury received yesterday - with the British suggestions underlined but no indication of U. S. decision.

Smyrnov then asked if we would also discuss the Bank. White said yes, that would be the third document discussed.

Smyrnov wondered if White contemplated a joint statement of principles on the Bank. White answered that maybe agreement could be on a fuller text in the case of the Bank. In any case the Bank and Fund statements would be separate documents.

Smyrnov said the Russians will study the joint statement and come on Thursday at 2:30.

Smyrnov asked if there was any further material they should have. White said nothing now - that they might have a new draft of the Bank later.
