REDEPTEL circular January 26 Canadian Delegation to Wilmington Island composed of following: James Ilsley, Minister of Finance as Governor both to bank and fund accompanied by wife, Clifford Clark, Deputy Minister of Finance as alternate bank governor, Graham Towers Governor of Bank of Canada as alternate fund governor, Louis Rasminsky alternate chairman Foreign Exchange Control Board and Executive Assistant to Governors of Bank of Canada as delegate and Charles Ritchie Chief of Division of Department of External Affairs dealing with international organizations and peace settlements as delegate. No clerical staff will be taken by delegation. As Department has been informed Canadian Delegation would like to proceed by the special train which it is understood will carry delegations from Washington to Wilmington Island to arrive there in time for first meeting March 8 and would like to be informed of the time at which it should be in Washington in order to board this train.
