

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Banking and Currency Committee

- SPENCE, (D. Ky.) Delegate to the Conference and extremely favorable. Voted for bill.
- BROWN, (D. Ga.) Started out antagonistic, but has been brought around and cooperates. He has stated that he is committed in favor of the Agreements and has asked us to prepare a speech for him. Voted for bill.
- PATMAN, (D. Tex.) Strongly in favor of the Agreements. Voted for bill.
- BARRY, (D. N.Y.) Isolationist record, has asked antagonistic questions and has been reported in the newspapers to be opposed. Catholic groups and the Democratic party have put pressure on him and it is understood that if he doesn't vote for the Agreements he will not vote at all. Told Spence he owes political debt to Laughlin of Interborough Bank who has influenced him to take ABA view. The Sec'y has been informed that he is now willing to vote for the Agreements. He is to make a public statement shortly. Voted for bill.
- MONRONEY, (D. Okla.) Strong internationalist record and is for the Agreements. He is a friend of Ferguson (State Department) who has assured us that Monroney will support us. Voted for bill.
- FOLGER, (D. N.C.) Good internationalist record, appears favorable, asks helpful questions. Made a long favorable speech on the floor of the House on 4/19, analysing the agreements.
- BALDWIN, (D. Md.) Has asked antagonistic questions and also reported by Drew Pearson and P.M. to be opposed. He wrote Pearson that the statement was untrue, but he did not say that he is for Bretton Woods. He has also written to Spence, but we do not have a copy of his letter to Spence. He has 218 favorable letters and only 2 opposed. The Sun papers are bringing pressure on him at home. Wrote Baltimore Sun he is in favor of Bretton Woods. Voted for bill.
- HAYS, (D. Ark.) Good internationalist record, and Spence is confident that he is for the Agreements. Inserted Cong. Rains favorable speech in the Congressional Record. Voted for bill.
- HOCH, (D. Pa.) Good internationalist record, and Spence is confident that he is for the Agreements. Voted for bill.
- OUTLAND, (D. Calif.) Strongly in favor of the Agreements and has cooperated extensively on strategy and questioning of witnesses. He has also inserted favorable material in the Congressional Record. Voted for bill.
- THOM, (D. Ohio) Strongly in favor of Bretton Woods and has indicated to us orally that he is greatly irritated both by the opposition and by the Republican members of the Committee. Voted for bill.
- QUINN (D. N.Y.) Spence is confident that he is for the Agreements, but he has taken little part in the hearings. Daily Worker reports that he pledged support on Bretton Woods to the CIO. Voted for bill.
- WOODHOUSE, (D. Conn.) Strongly in favor of the Agreements and cooperates on questioning witnesses. Voted for bill.



- RILEY, (D. S.C.) Has indicated orally that he favors the Agreements and has cooperated in questioning witnesses. Voted for bill.
- RAINS, (D. Ala.) Has asked very helpful questions at the hearings. Made a Jefferson Day speech praising Bretton Woods.
- HULL, (P. Wis.) Isolationist record and appears to be hostile, but the Farmers Union has promised to deliver his vote. Voted for bill.
- WOLCOTT, (R. Mich.) Still on the fence, but is disturbed by the Pearson and P.M. reports that he is against the Agreements. Voted for bill.
- CRAWFORD, (R. Mich.) Said on the floor of the House the Congress would unquestionably approve the Agreements. Has asked reasonable questions, but has recently been very much disturbed by the pressure brought to bear upon him in Michigan. Voted for bill.
- GAMBLE, (R. N.Y.) Has inserted unfavorable material in the Congressional Record, but also inserted the CED report. Appears favorable at the hearings, but is disturbed about collection of information under the Trading with the enemy Act. Foley talked to him and said he seems friendly towards Bretton Woods. He is upset about P.M.'s statement that he is opposed. Voted for bill.
- SUMNER, (R. Ill.) Isolationist and hotly opposed to the Agreements. Voted against bill.
- SMITH, (R. Ohio) Isolationist; monetary crank; definitely opposed. Voted against bill.
- KUNKLE, (R. Pa.) Non-committal and is now in England talking to the British about the Agreements. Returned from England and, in conversation with EM. Bernstein, indicated he is in favor of Bretton Woods. Voted for bill.
- TALLE, (R. Iowa) Non-committal and his questioning has been more or less neutral. Voted for bill.
- SUNDSTROM, (R. N.J.) Has appeared hostile at the hearings. Inserted N.Y. Times adverse editorial in the Congressional Record. Voted for bill.
- KILBURN, (R. N.Y.) Mr. O'Connell talked to him and he seems to be on the fence, but wants to vote for the Agreements with slight modifications if he is not the only Republican in favor of them. He has a 100% internationalist record and wants to preserve it. Voted for bill.



BUFFETT, (R. Neb.) Isolationist and has made a very hostile speech on the radio. Voted against bill.

BRUMBAUGH, (R. Pa.) Member of the Executive Board of the Independent Bankers Association. His name appears on their report. At the hearings his questions have not been very favorable. Voted for bill.
