## Roosevelt Calls Money Parley

### 42 Nations Invited To Stabilization Talks

President Roosevelt yesterday called an international monetary conference at which 41 nations and the French National Committee of Liberation will discuss international fiscal problems beginning the first week of July at Bretton Woods, N. H., in the Berkshire Mountains.

The invitation, which went out Thursday night, emphasized that the settlement of monetary problems is of vital concern to all nations in the years of peace.

The major topics at the conference, the President said in the invitation, will be economic co-operation and the creation of an international bank for reconstruction and development.

The invitations were delivered during the day throughout the world by diplomatic representatives to the countries addressed. Delivery was made to governments in exile in the cases of occupied nations.

The conference is expected to last two or three weeks. Mr. Roosevelt emphasized that the invitation states that the governments shall pass upon whatever plan the delegates agree on.
