Practices and Agreements

- J-1 If a member presents a formal complaint to the Executive Board that another member is not complying with its obligations concerning exchange controls, discriminatory currency arrangements, or multiple currency practices, the complaint shall specify the obligation violated, the acts constituting such violation and all facts pertinent to an examination of the complaint by the Fund. (AA VIII 2 and 3)
- J-2 Upon receipt of a formal complaint from a member, the Executive Board shall make arrangements promptly for consultation with the directly involved member against which the complaint is made.
- J-B All requests by a member that the Fund approve the imposition of restrictions on the making of payments and transfers for current international transactions, or the use of discriminatory currency arrangements or multiple currency practices, shall be submitted to the Executive Board in writing, with a statement of the reasons for making the request. (AA VIII-2 and 3)
- J-5 The Executive Board shall decide each request for approval within 30 days of its receipt, if the member wishes it to be acted upon promptly.
- J-5 A request by the Fund that a member exercise controls to prevent net use of the Fund's resources to meet a large or sustained outflow of capital shall be accompanied by a report setting forth the reasons for the request. The member shall consult with the Executive Board or heir institution as to the administration of such controls and the centinued need for them. (AA VI-1)

J. Exchange Controls

J 1. Any member desiring to maintain restrictions on payments and transfers for current international transactions under Article XIV must to it he time of the mostification so inform the Fund within one month of the beginning of operations by the Fund or of becoming a member (whichever is the later), together with a description of the principles and practice of such restrictions with by reasons for Tarin maintinance J 2. All members shall inform the Fund of any legislative, executive or administrative provisions under which payments and transfers for international transactions will be subject to scrutiny, stating whether such exchange controls will restrict capital or current transactions, and if so to what extent, This information shall be kept up-to-date. J 3. Since the Fund is concerned only with the practical consequences of any system of exchange control, it shall not object to the form in which any system is expressed, nor shall it specify under Article VI Section 1(a) the form of control which it expects a member to enforce. It shall however be available to advise members who desire guidance as to the practice of other members and the efficacy of their methods. 3 40 If the operation of any system of exchange control appears to the Fund to result in unnecessary restrictions on current payments and

transfers, or otherwise to be contrary to the obligations of members

under the Articles, the Fund shall seek an explanation from the member.

If the explanation is not satisfactory after opportunities of full exchange of views have been afforded, the Fund may rule that the member is failing to fulfil its obligations and may restrict the use of the Fund's resources by that member.

- J 5. The Fund shall keep all exchange controls under review and shall consult with members in accordance with the Articles with a view to their progressive removal.
- J 6. If a member states that its balance of payments position will require it to impose restrictions on payments and transfers for current international transactions it shall so inform the Fund with details of its proposed form of control and the policy proposed to be pursued by it. The Fund shall treat this proposal as a matter of urgency and shall indicate its views, either provisionally or in detail, within 72 hours. If the Fund and the member disagree the member shall be regarded as failing to fulfil its obligations under the Articles.
- J 7. The exchange control provisions of members shall be deemed to be consistent with the Articles for the purposes of Article VIII Section 2(b) unless the Fund has informed members to the contrary.

In the event of legal proceedings in the territories of a member involving the question of the enforceability of a contract under exchange control legislation, whether of that member or another, the Fund shall on request furnish to the member in whose territories the action proceeds a certificate stating whether the exchange control legislation concerned has been ruled by the Fund to be inconsistent with the Articles, and members shall be entitled to produce such a certificate in their courts.

J.S. When the Fund declares a currency scarce, it shall consult promptly with members as to the steps they propose to take to limit their expenditures in that currency to the available supply, and shall inform the member whose currency has been declared scarce of the limitations imposed by other members. The Fund shall offer its good offices if the member wishes to make representations on the administration of the limitations so imposed. If the limitations imposed by any member exceed the needs of the situation in the view of the Fund, it may so inform the member. If the Fund and the member disagree and the member persists in imposing excessive limitations it shall be regarded as failing to fulfil its obligations under the Articles.
