There is attached a memorandum proposing additions to the braft Rules and Regulations concerning transactions in gold, the prices to be paid for gold, and charges for gold transactions.

These provisions have been discussed with Er. Bernstein end Er. Fisher. When he first sew the proposals, Mr. Fisher was somewhat troubled about determining at this time the gold transactions in which the Fund will engage. He thought that many of these satters should be left until the Fund had had gone experience in actual operations. Although the present Draft seets come of the points related by Mr. Fisher, it is only fair to say that he is not fully satisfied as to the desirability of iscorporating all of this material in the cules and Regulations at present. It should be pointed out, however, that although it is not necessary to include provisions at this time concerning the matters dealt with in the attached draft, once it is concluded that some reference to gold transactions is necessary, there is a vertain minimum of provisions which must be included.
