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A B C's in general should be regarded with considerable reserve. Most of the time the proponent of an A B C simplifies things by stating in simple terms what he wants or believes, carefully omitting everything that interferes with his one-two-three explanation. When a person offers you the A B C of the proposed International Bank, it means that he is all for an International Bank, and what could be simpler than that? Similarly, the A B C of how to rule Germany after the victory or the A B C of the World Security and the Little Nations will be found to consist of a person's own very definite ideas on the subject. Could anything be simpler?
