## AFL Asks Guarantees In Bretton Woods Plan

Washington, Apr. 27 (AP)—AFL President William Green to-day urged Congress to approve the Bretton Woods monetary agreements after adding provisions he said would protect labor.

Terming approval of plans for a world bank and currency sta. it is both a matter of human bilization fund of "vital import- decency and also a matter of enance," Green suggested to the House Banking Committee that these two policy declarations be

1. That consultation with the international labor organizations be made a basic administrative procedure before deciding upon use of funs. 2. That in consider-ing bank loans the recipient be required to guarantee observance of prevailing wages and hours, saiety and health standards and,

lightened self-interest on the part of the U.S. to share in restoring the pre-war economic status of our Allies."

"It will be necessary to take action in other important fields, such as food, cartels, surplus commodities, aviation and others, and it is not to be expected that the Bretton Woods agreements alone will afford a complete solution to post-war chaos in international trade. "We do believe, howin general, the labor standards and, recommended by the ILO.

"Matter of Decency"

"The American Federation of Labor," Green said, "believes that these agreements can make a substantial contribution towards solving immediate and Long-term problems of exclange and international investment," Green said.
