All of which has combined to produce an attitude bordering on futility which has not been improved by the United States' apparently divergent intentions toward Latin American nations. They note that we are joined with Latin America in the Chapultepec regional defense proposition at the same time we are committed to he Yalta world police plan which would prohibit any such regionally united force. Thus, unable to do much more than watch the maneuvering, their interest is mainly that of a spectator.
