Subject: Report on the 1984 Annual Meeting

The Board of Governors held its 1984 Annual Meeting in Washington, D.C., from September 24-27. The Annual Meeting was preceded by meetings of the Interim Committee and the Development Committee.

The Interim Committee met on September 22, 1984, with Mr. Willy De Clercq as Chairman. The Press Communiqué of the Interim Committee was circulated as Fund Press Release No. 84/33. On September 24, 1984, the Board of Governors heard a report by Mr. De Clercq, which has been circulated as Joint Press Release No. 12. The Committee agreed to hold its next meeting in Washington, D.C., in the spring of 1985.

The Development Committee met on September 23, 1984, with Mr. Ghulam Ishaq Khan as Chairman, and issued a Press Communiqué (unnumbered). The Board of Governors heard a report by Mr. Khan on September 26, 1984, which has been issued as Joint Press Release No. 39. The Chairman also presented a report by the Committee to the Board of Governors on the work of the Committee during the period July 1983 to June 1984, in compliance with Section 5(i) of the Fund Board of Governors Resolution No. 29-9, adopted October 2, 1974; this report has been circulated as a Joint Annual Meetings document (Fund Document No. 5). The Development Committee agreed to meet again in the spring of 1985. <sup>1/</sup> The concluding remarks of the Chairman will be circulated to the Committee of the Whole on the Development Committee as EB/CW/DC/84/5.

The Development Committee also held a meeting on September 24, 1984, at which it selected His Excellency Ghulam Ishaq Khan, Minister for Finance, Commerce, and Economic Coordination of Pakistan to serve as Chairman for a second term.
