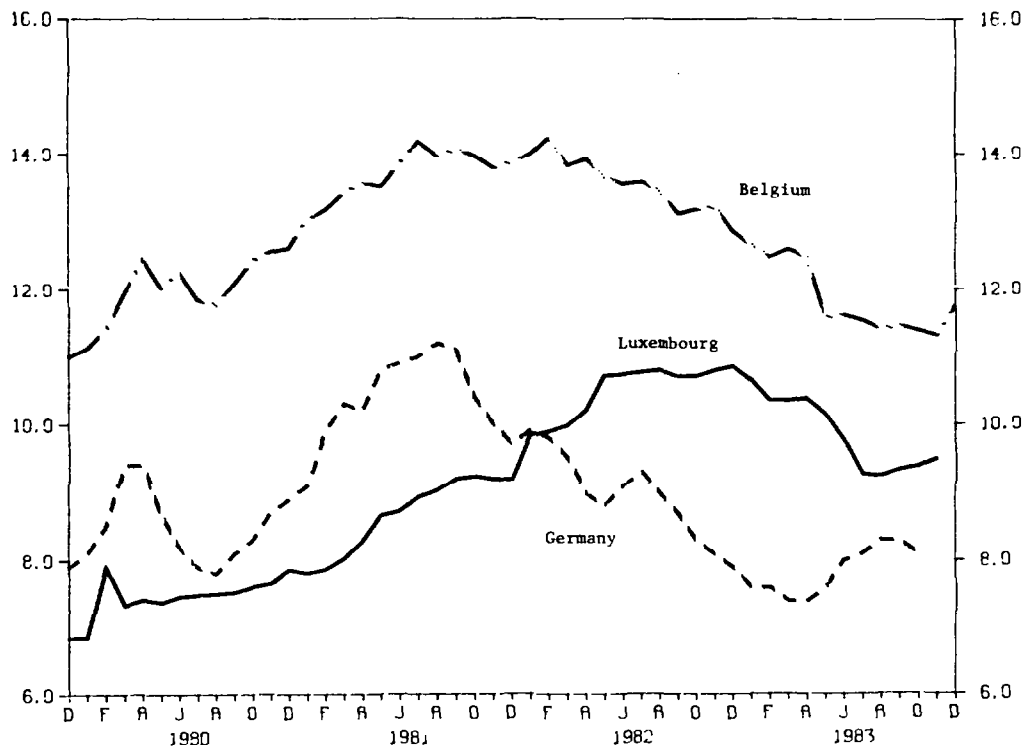

Chart 1. Government Bond Yields, 1980-83

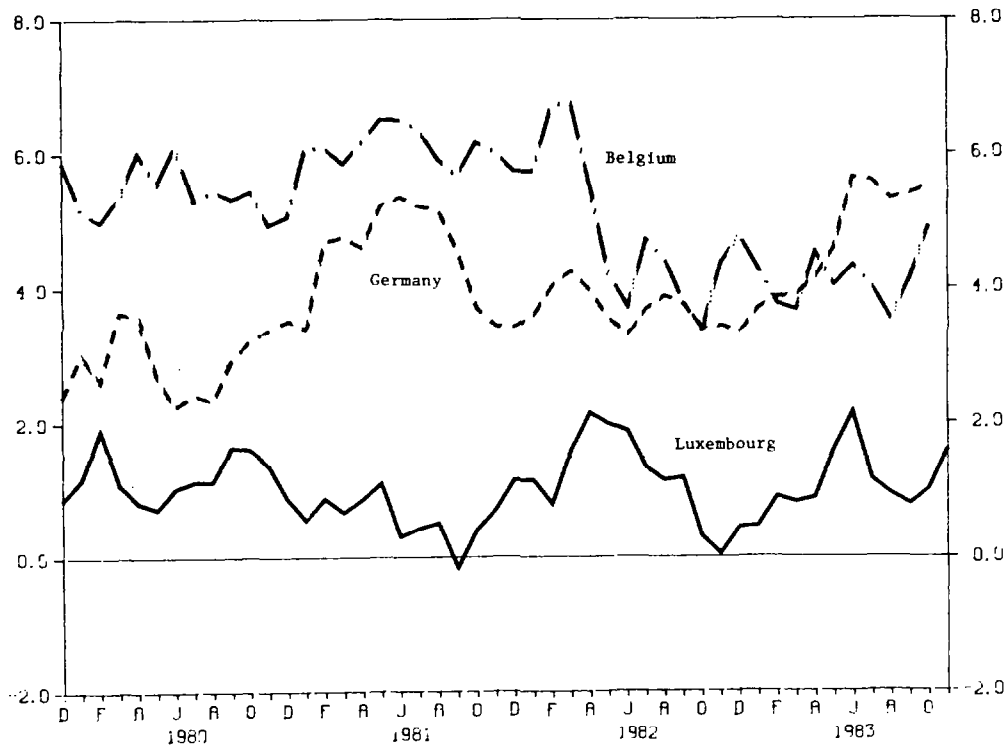

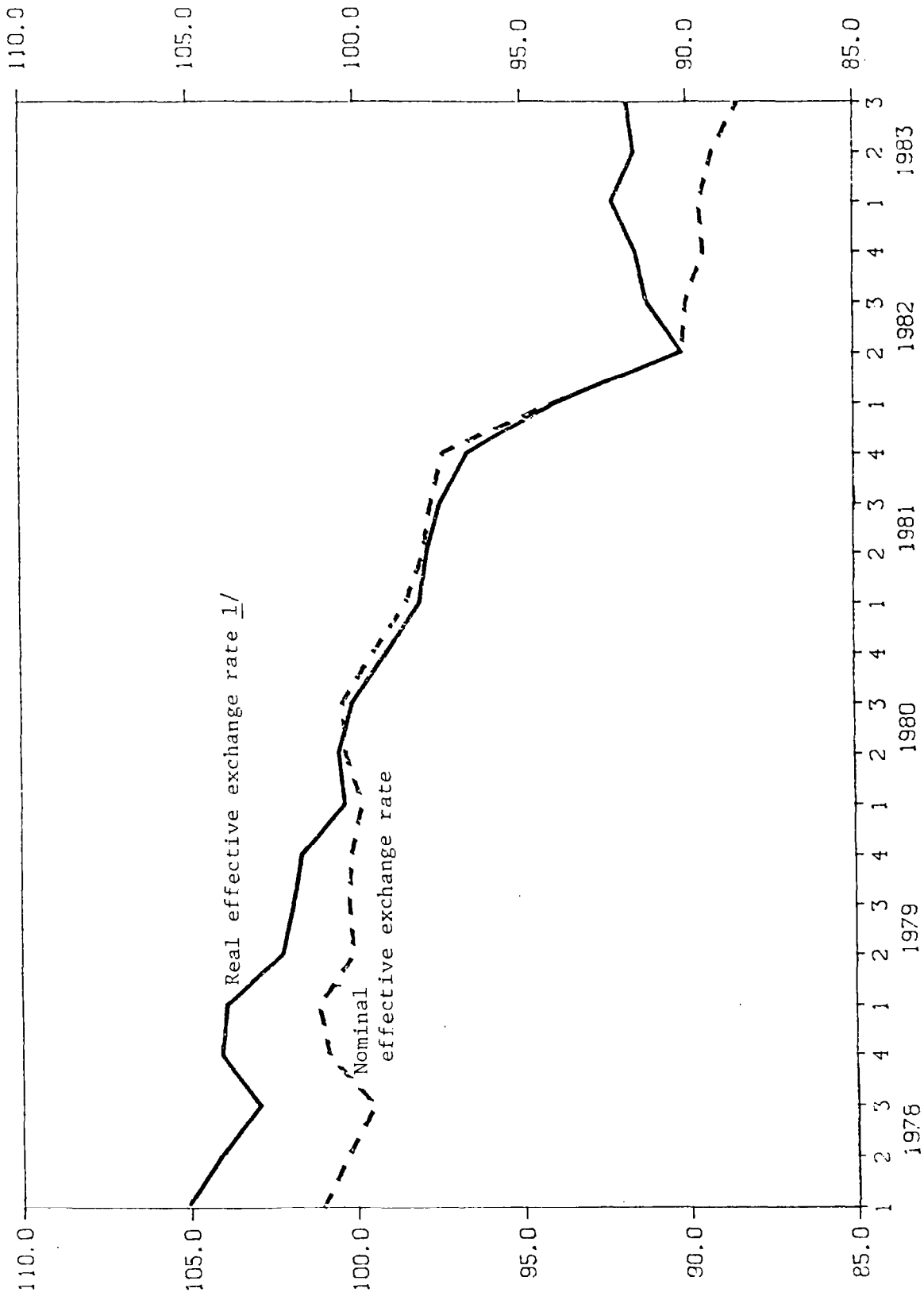
