In the attached notification dated June 2, 1983 the Nepalese authorities have informed the Fund that effective June 1 the Nepalese rupee has been pegged to a composite of several currencies reflecting Nepal's trade pattern. Previously fixed rates for the rupee were maintained in terms of both the U.S. dollar and the Indian rupee, giving rise to a multiple currency practice subject to Fund approval under Article VIII. At the time of the 1982 Article IV consultation (SM/82/210) approval was not given for the maintenance by Nepal of the multiple currency practice. On the basis of the new basket, the Nepal Rastra Bank quotes daily the mid-point rate of the rupee for the U.S. dollar. The buying and selling rates for the dollar on June 1 and 2 were NRs 14.40 and NRs 14.60 respectively, compared with NRs. 14.20 and NRs.14.40 before the new arrangement was introduced, representing a depreciation of of 1.4 per cent.

A staff team recently visited Kathmandu to conduct the 1983 Article IV consultation discussions with Nepal. A report to the Executive Board of these discussions is being prepared and will contain further background information on this change in Nepal's exchange arrangements, which has eliminated the multiple currency practice.
