Subject: Education Allowance - Extension of Adjustments
to Executive Directors and Alternates

Board of Governors Resolution 34-7 provides that the Executive Board may make available to Executive Directors and their Alternates, changes in levels of benefits to reflect actual costs, or other minor modifications to existing benefits that do not change the basic nature of such benefits. The adjustment of education allowances for staff approved by the Executive Board on Monday, August 1, 1983 (EBAP/83/196, 7/27/83) would seem to fall within the terms of this Resolution. The adjustments are listed below and are to be effective for the first full scholastic year which starts after August 1, 1983. The Committee on Executive Board Administrative Matters recommends that the Executive Board approve the extension of the revisions to Executive Directors and Alternates.

1. The maximum allowance for tuition in duty station countries shall be increased to \$3,700 from \$3,400 per annum.
2. The maximum "base allowance" for tuition and boarding fees in nonduty station countries shall be increased to \$5,400 from \$5,000 per annum.
3. When children are studying outside the duty station country, the "base" subsistence grants at primary and secondary levels shall be raised to \$1,300 from \$1,200 per annum and at post-secondary level to \$2,600 from \$2,400 per annum.
