Subject: Report of the Standing Joint Committee on the Remuneration of
Executive Directors and Their Alternates - Voting Results

In accordance with the decision of the Executive Board recorded in the minutes of EBM/83/79, June 2, 1983, the Secretary has canvassed the votes cast by Governors on the Resolutions submitted to the Board of Governors on June 2, 1983, with respect to (1) Direct Remuneration of Executive Directors and their Alternates, and (2) Home Leave Allowance for Executive Directors and their Alternates.

The voting has been completed. Under Section 13 of the By-Laws, the replies of a majority of Governors (74) representing two thirds (431,399) of the total voting power (647,098) are required for a quorum. Article XII, Section 5(c) provides that, except as otherwise specifically provided, all decisions of the Fund shall be made by a majority of the votes cast. These requirements have been met with respect to both Resolutions.

With respect to the Resolution on Direct Remuneration of Executive Directors and their Alternates, a total of 404,383 votes was validly cast by 124 members in favor of the Resolution. A total of 222,570 votes was validly cast by six members against the Resolution. Accordingly, this Resolution is adopted by the Board of Governors, effective July 6, 1983. The Resolution will be designated No. 38-3.

With respect to the Resolution on Home Leave Allowance for Executive Directors and their Alternates, a total of 538,138 votes was validly cast by 127 members in favor of the Resolution. A total of 88,815 votes was validly cast by three members against the Resolution. Accordingly, this Resolution is adopted by the Board of Governors, effective July 6, 1983, and will be designated No. 38-4.

The votes of each member with respect to each Resolution are shown in the attached tables. The ballots and all correspondence relating to the voting are available for inspection in the Secretary's Department.

Unless an Executive Director requests that this matter be placed on the agenda, this report will be deemed approved as of the close of business today, Thursday, July 7, 1983. The Executive Board's approval will be recorded in the minutes of the next meeting. Members will be informed of the results.
