Subject: **Republic of Uzbekistan—Statistical Appendix**

This paper provides background information to the staff report for the 2011 Article IV consultation with the Republic of Uzbekistan (SM/11/334, 12/22/11), which is being considered on a lapse of time basis. The Secretary's Department has been notified by the authorities of the Republic of Uzbekistan that their explicit consent is required prior to the publication of Board documents on the Republic of Uzbekistan. At the time of circulation of this paper to the Board, the Secretary's Department has not received a communication from the authorities indicating that they consent to the Fund's publication of this paper; such communication may be received after the authorities have had an opportunity to read the paper. Any requests for modifications for publications are expected to be received two days before the Board concludes its consideration.
