Subject: Panama - Settlement of Overdue Financial Obligations to the  
Fund and Termination of Suspension of Right to Use SDRs

As Executive Directors were informed at EBM/90/83, 5/30/90, on May 23, 1990 Panama made a payment of SDR 6.5 million to the Fund. The authorities attributed part of this payment to the full settlement of Panama's overdue net SDR charges and SDR assessments and Panama thereby became current in its obligations to the Fund with respect to SDRs.

In light of the full settlement of Panama's overdue obligations with respect to SDRs, I propose that the suspension of Panama's right to use SDRs, as provided in Executive Board Decision No. 9205-(89/85) G/S, adopted June 30, 1989, as amended, be terminated. This would be accomplished by the adoption of the proposed decision set out below, which provides for the termination of the suspension with effect on May 23, 1990, the date payment was made.

Proposed Decision

The Fund decides that the suspension of the right of Panama to use its SDRs, as provided in Executive Board Decision No. 9205-(89/85) G/S, adopted June 30, 1989, as amended, is terminated with effect on May 23, 1990.
