Subject: Regulations for the Conduct of the 1988 Regular Election
of Executive Directors - Results of Voting on Board of
Governors' Resolution

In accordance with the decision of the Executive Board recorded in the minutes of EBM/88/120 (8/1/88), the Secretary has canvassed the votes cast by Governors on the Resolution submitted to the Board of Governors on August 2, 1988, with respect to the Regulations for the Conduct of the 1988 Regular Election of Executive Directors.

The voting has been completed. Under Section 13 of the By-Laws, the replies of a majority of the Governors (76), exercising two thirds (625,084) of the total voting power (937,625), are required for a quorum. Furthermore, 85 percent (796,982) of the total voting power must be in favor of the Resolution for its adoption pursuant to Article XII, Section 3(b). These requirements have been met. A total of 896,123 votes were validly cast by 120 members in favor of the Resolution. Accordingly, the Resolution is adopted by the Board of Governors, effective September 6, 1988, and will be designated No. 43-4.

The votes of each member are shown in the attached table. The ballots and all correspondence relating to the voting are available for inspection in the Secretary's Department.

Unless an Executive Director requests that this matter be placed on the agenda, this report will be deemed approved as of the close of business today, Wednesday, September 7, 1988. The Executive Board's approval will be recorded in the minutes of the next meeting. Members will be informed of the results.
